

INTRODUCTION

The sperm donors we supply are volunteers, and there is no charge for their sperm. However, the process of recruiting donors and testing and preparing semen for use is time-consuming and costly, and we will charge you for the services we provide as part of this process.

These costs include but are not limited to medical consultations with the donor, sperm and blood tests including infection screening, chromosome and other appropriate genetic tests, counselling, freezing of sperm and testing thawed samples, preparation, transportation and storage of the sperm, legal issues as well as logistics of managing the supply and final transport to the end user. There are also administrative costs associated with meeting the regulatory requirements in NSW, which include the collection and secure storage of donor and recipient information, maintaining records of offspring born from donor semen, provision of information to the NSW central donor register, and ensuring compliance with statutory time limits governing the use of donor sperm.

If you are using an overseas sperm donor, you will need to pay the overseas sperm bank direct for the services they provide. We will advise you what these costs will be once you have chosen your donor and we know which sperm bank will be supplying the sperm.

If you are using a local donor, Fertility East will charge you a fee to cover these costs. In order to keep the cost of semen donation as low as possible, our cost structure is based around recouping the actual cost of these services rather than making a profit. We do this by charging a fee per vial of donor sperm used. Despite the fact that NSW law now permits the semen from one donor to be used to treat only five women, Fertility East has managed to maintain its previous cost structure for local donors.

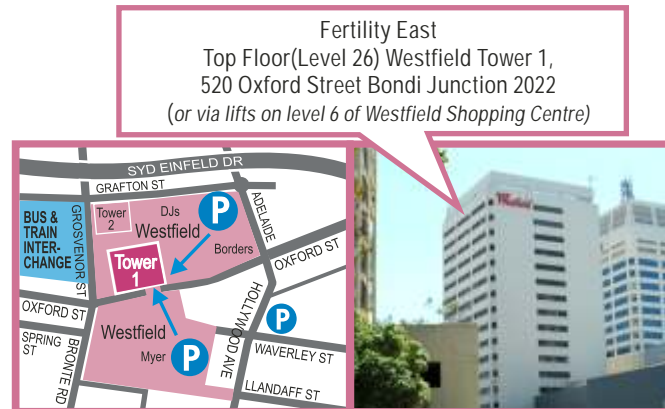

CALCULATING THE COST OF TREATMENT *(There are 3 components)*

1. FERTILITY EAST FACILITY FEE

● Counselling of Recipients	\$ 150
● Nurse Counsellor Coordination fee	\$ 450
● Cryostorage of Donor Sperm on behalf of recipient (per year)	\$ 300
● Administrative Costs and Logistics	\$ 450

2. FERTILITY EAST TREATMENT CYCLE FEE

Intra-Uterine Insemination (IUI)	FIRST DAY FEE	\$ 1,240.90
IVF (Initial cycle)	Calendar Year FIRST DAY FEE	\$ 3,541.75

Information regarding imported Donor Sperm

The Regulations

The recent changes in legislation means that many of the donors we had access to up until 1 January 2010 do not comply with the changes in legislation either they have donated to more than 5 recipients, or they do not consent to having their information added to a central register. We have worked tirelessly to increase the number of donors available to our patients, and to ensure that our patients, donors and associated organisations comply with these specific regulations governed by NSW legislation.

The Process

Unfortunately, the current situation means that the demand for donor sperm far outweighs supply. By keeping this in mind, we would like you to treat any chance of selection of a donor as a matter of urgency to ensure we give every patient the first available opportunity to make their selection.

As such, we trust you understand the pressure on us to assist as many of you as possible as soon as possible and request that you adhere to the tight timeframes within

The Fees

To ensure your selection is reserved for you, you will need to fix your account up when you attend the clinic.

There will be two separate fees,

- the Sperm Bank fee
- the Fertility East facility fee

We are hoping to increase supply and therefore increase options to our patients, but at this stage each patient is required to reserve a minimum of five vials. The cost of this will vary based on the way the sperm has been prepared, but the average fee should be approximately \$USD2500 for five vials. There will be no refund on unused vials.

Please be aware that once your choice has been made and the transaction completed, it is irreversible.

The second fee is explained in the included brochure.

There will be an ongoing annual storage fee, with your consent, for your donor sperm of \$300, unless you choose not to use any remaining vials, in which case they will be destroyed. Alternatively if there is no contact or payment from you for 2 years, the remaining vials will be destroyed.

The Payment Process

Payment for (a) is made directly to the overseas sperm bank and must be made at the time you make your selection at the clinic. The reason for this is that you will be using the Pay Pal Payment method over the internet which will require information about the donor that we will need to provide.

Credit card is the only accepted form of payment for this.

Payment for (b) is made at reception at Fertility East at the same time.

You will be issued with a receipt for both payments however neither payment is covered by a Medicare Rebate.
